Congratulations to Willoughby Hills Senior Apartments (Clover Development) on Chardon Road! Their ribbon cutting this month was a huge success. The 55 and over senior living facility is nearly 70% filled to capacity. It is so rewarding to see residents who have chosen to downsize now make their home still within the City of Willoughby Hills. I plan to visit the facility on a regular basis and will update you as things progress.

The City received an AFSCME mailing which indicates that the administrative employees plan to unionize. Over the next several months we will be reviewing this plan and complying as necessary. The City already recognizes labor unions for the Police Sergeants, Police Patrol Officers, Police Dispatchers, Service Workers, and Firefighters and provide for three-year contracts for these groups.

We continue to meet with our City Engineer and other parties concerning the upcoming work on Worrell Road and Route 91. These will be our two major road projects for 2016. Work is anticipated to begin in September. I am working to ensure that there is the least possible imposition on our residents and the motorists in those areas. Both are very busy routes, but we will do our best to alleviate traffic concerns and, as always, make it safe.
