Since my report last month, I am pleased to report that Civil Service Commission administered the full-time Police and Fire Examinations and we now have a nice selection of candidates to consider for employment with the City of Willoughby Hills. The Civil Service Commission will now finalize the list and interviews will begin.

Pat Flowers, Inc. has completed the Pavement Markings Program throughout the City and we are very pleased with the results.

Specialized Construction will be starting the work on Stark Drive in early July and then will proceed to pave Rockefeller. These are two major road work projects that we are anxious to complete for the ease of motorists in that area.

Cuyahoga County Airport runway will continue to be closed as part of Phase 2 (of 4 Phases) for the Airport Improvement Project. Residents in this area will notice "quiet time" until the runway re-opens.
