

MAYOR'S REPORT
JUNE 2010

Work is finally underway for the Maple Grove slope repair. We will close Maple Grove Road until approximately July 30, 2010. The end result will be a much-needed repair of the area near Parsons and Maple Grove. Please adhere to the posted speeds and detours during this construction period.

Area C residents will continue to see the progress in the area of White Road on the sewer installation project. Your patience in travelling these areas that have been affected by this project is appreciated.

A NOPEC grant was made availability to the City of Willoughby Hills for energy conservation projects. The first submission was for Grange re-roofing and attic venting for \$15,000. Without this maintenance, the building would not have been habitable for much longer. The City would not have been able to afford any funding for this project; therefore, we felt it was the perfect project to apply for via the NOPEC grant. We were pleased to learn our request was granted and \$15,000 will be provided for this repair. In addition, the City Hall HVAC system is not operating and a request for further NOPEC funds was submitted. We were pleased to learn that \$94,000 was allocated for this project.

Willoughby Hills Day at Classic Park turned out to be a very memorable event. Not only did our residents and friends who purchased tickets enjoy the great baseball weather, but they were able to witness the Lake County Captains clinch the Division Championship title with their outstanding win. Thanks again to all who supported this City function.
