It has been our practice to sell surplus vehicles and equipment on the internet. This month, our internet auction closed and we were able to sell three police cars, a 1999 Service Department snow plow and some miscellaneous Service Department equipment. We netted approximately \$25,000 from this auction. We have two other Service Department vehicles that did not meet the reserve on auction and we will either use them as trades for future vehicle for re-list them for internet auction in October. The internet auctions have served to produce greater amounts as opposed to local sales of the items. We will continue to use this venue for disposal twice a year.
