## LAW DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Thomas G. Lobe, L.P.A.

- Ordinance No. 2011-24, Ordinance No. 2011- 25, Ordinance No. 2011-26, Ordinance No. 2011-27
- City Council is being asked to consider four proposed Ordinances (as listed above) authorizing pension pickup plans for unions representing the full-time members of the Service Department, Police Department (Dispatchers and Police Officers) and the Fire Department (Firefighters) that were agreed to in the recently completed labor agreements. The plans cannot be implemented until approved by City Council
- The proposed Ordinances are based upon sample ordinances prepared by the Ohio Public Employees Retirement System and the Ohio Police and Firefighters Pension and disability fund.
- The Clerk of Council provided the representative of each of the pension funds with draft copies of the ordinances affecting their pension fund for review. Each pension fund deemed the ordinances to be acceptable.
- The above authorized pension pickup plans are to be reflected in Chapter 157

## FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Frank J. Brichacek, Jr.

- Procedurally once the plans have been authorized the plans will be filed with the appropriate pension boards and then the City will be able to implement these pension pickup plans as agreed to in the labor agreements.
- The Finance Director pointed out, from a financial point of view, this is really a win-win for both the City and the employees because the cost of this pick up plan will put \$83.00 more in an employee's take home pay and only increase the cost of the City by a \$100.00 and that is per \$10,000 of salary.
- If the City had granted a 1% salary increase, the employees take home pay would have only been increased by \$71.00 again, this is per \$10,000 of salary while the City's costs would go up anywhere from \$115.00 to \$121.00 per \$10,000 of salary; a difference of 13% to 20% so it is really a win-win for all sides.
- What the City will end up with is a hybrid pick up plan; this will combine the City's employee pension contributions are currently treated as with what is called the "fringe benefit" employer pick up plan.
- We have a combination of two pick up plans.
- The Finance Director also noted that the acquisition of the vehicles for the Police Department's are included in the City's Operating Budget, Fund #234
- Reported that the \$250,000 Note that Council authorized was priced out and the note has a face interest rate of 2% but an effective rate of 2.50%; higher than the note that was done previously but then there are two things: (1) This is a taxable issue, not tax exempt issue, so it has to bear a higher interest rate because if a private entity buys it, they have to pay income tax and (2) In the scheme of things a \$250,000 Note is very small and not very easy to market.

## Order of Business

This is a meeting to review of where we are: Master Plan (MP) was distributed electronically months ago, some requested hard copy. Mayor and Law Director requested (Mayor later said Council President ordered) Council Clerk do a side by side version on hard copy for Council to see changes and deletions. Some computer issues delayed delivery – should be in Council's mailbox this upcoming week. Council had the duty to accept or reject and resubmit to Commission. Council does not write the plan. We can suggest changes or note things like typos however. Both the current and proposed versions are on the City website.

<u>Schryer</u> for questions and statement: DB Hart started the process. He authored much of the MP and the Commission has accomplished much, Zoning Districts reflect all new Zoning Codes. Things were taken out on this update that are no longer pertinent. Revised numerous items, a dozen or more. *How many public meetings took place?* Not sure but can check. *Council Clerk retrieved minutes and we show approximately 27 public meetings*. We reviewed the business districts, stormwater management, wind/solar, and much of this information came from places like OSU, we lifted new information from reliable sources. Pulling in data, like balanced growth, tax tables, we updated the maps for the new Zoning Districts. Key issues and land use. Business owners, developing foot traffic ability. Recreation: bike trails - no connection. A longer discussion ensued about bringing in recreation issues.

The 1983 Recreation MP has not been implemented. We now have Warner Nursery, Gullybrook Park, Grange, a vision for Bocce Courts and new restrooms/pavilion, Garfield and moving soccer, football fields; Manakiki is not mentioned - integral to the City. We could do a more thorough job of making a vision for the direction of the recreational offering to our residents. At minimum we should list all the facilities. At best, a vision for how we want the offerings to be in five - ten years. Perhaps get Recreation Commission members involved in a MP section to be added to this.

Schryer – This is a standalone document that holds up. Fellows – Events and a calendar of events added. Lillich – Looking back, we have a history, going forward we have a use of each property and a vision for the future. Fiebig - we add the 2010 census data- discussion on the mechanics of adding, look to perhaps add section on recreation. In-depth review of Town Center idea. Schryer - agreed it needs work in Planning Commission - input developed the plan. Updated in 03, was available, deleted out, some political issue and some to do with how much have been included – too much to press into updating 2003. We did a lot. Lillich – left out by caution on reaction to it. Lot of discussion. Agreed there should be no haphazard development of a Town Center, it should be done as a unit, to be able to control the look & "feel". West end is an example of scattered owners and haphazard development. Smith – Have a theme – no flat box, encourage foot traffic, community center to restaurants. There is room for development. Bike paths add texture. Weger -Zoning on Rt 91. Schryer had discussion with Hart about 3 weeks ago – he thought the update was good. Germano – Don't put Town Center idea in MP – can cause speculation and drive up cost, **Fellows** agreed, used airport analogy to show a plan disrupts RE values unnecessarily, wait until more ready to move. Malecek - Limited vision in MP. Lillich -Lohmann's (West end) 76% vacancy, nobody with a vision. Fiebig- Shoregate in Willowick example. Cihula- Left off Zoning Map - If you leave it off, how do investors know that we might be looking to build/improve. He gets calls. **Reichelt** - needs 2 weeks to review the complied draft. **Fiebig** - We want to be able to complete and approve this year like to be this summer.

Chairman Fiebig thanked the members for their appearance tonight and their hard work on the MP.

Councilman Reichelt further stated that the acquisition would still be through the State Purchasing Program and the price would be fixed. The Mayor stated that the decision is to pass it the way it is today; they are going to try to locate cars; however, they did cut off because of the Tsunami in Japan, they did cut off the ordering of cars for a couple of reasons: (1) it was that a couple of the components in the Dodge Charge, specifically the black paint which is produced in Japan and there is a shortage. Pass this Ordinance and basically what we will have is that we will be ordering 2012 Charges from Greve for the same price; we just won't have shipment until sometime in September or December when those cars come off the line. Now if we find some more, we can have a new Ordinance with all the exhibits that would have the right Dealerships name. Right now, Greve is the closest to the City that does the State bidding, there may be some down in Cincinnati or Columbus that have some on the lot and that would be the only way that we could get those. So right now, we want to put our order in and be the first to get 2012 cars with Greve and then if some become available we can actually pass a new Ordinance and these can be our new 2012 vehicles, if we chose because, right now we are behind with our vehicles because we purchased none last year.

Law Director Lobe commented that he and the Mayor spoke about this issue earlier this afternoon and it is ironic how it is written and the circumstances are that we are not locked in and the circumstances are that we might get 2012 and 2011 prices and this also gives us a few extra months to even stretch out the other cars, not that we were planning to do that, but it is a little bit of a win all the way around. If it does come that we have to amend it at that time, he will review it; he asked Council that they pass it as it is tonight because it is prepared under the notation that we are not going to get until later but there is not a time limit on it this one either or an attachment that states a specific car.
