Germano – pretty cut and dry proposal. 1,800 to 2,000 people involved in this – 2,400 homes. Thinking going to have 1,800 containers. Bags are cheaper than what we are paying now. Curbside recycling for the same price.

Consensus of those in attendance to move forward with an Ordinance to procure trash service – move forward with vast Communication Plan – meetings to sign-up with them – arrangements to get bins out. Bag customers. Rates locked in for five-years. Does change, but we know what the rates are for five-years.

Do you have rubbish service today? You have to know — that's not really there — nitpicking and dividing it up. You are telling Republic — where does the opt-out part have to come in. Two things are your just ignoring — private service — you are going to have your private service — make it a utility. It all ends up in the same dump yard — yes, it is true — all of those places have different trucks and different services. What is the inclusion of the City/IT Dispatch service in the TIF? That million-bucks you collect off of your taxes — chump change for you guys — that's my opinion. What are the other three things? 91 and Stark Pump station, Chardon Road resurfacing. I'll take the money — if it's there I'll take it. How come I feel abused and singled out — Pine Ridge already has there's — what about the gated community? The driveway is in Willoughby — it's private there. Frank Cihula — if you go with the colored bags, you don't get a quarterly bill? No minimum on the bags.
