- Finance Department continues to work with the State Auditors relative to closing 2006.
- Councilman Fiebig inquired about Account 460 which will allow the Recreation Department to have faster and/or quicker access to some funding for City fundraising activities.

# Meeting Convened at 7:11 p.m.

Continued discussion on <u>Ordinance 2008-49</u>; additional received comments from Chief Collins and Mayor's Executive Assistant regarding noise complaints for construction and other practices.

Collins: Ruckus, noise, neighborhoods, live bands. New construction is a problem - new condo areas at Pine Ridge - no time frame for construction companies to start and stop. Policies from other cities. The ordinance we have works for parties, ruckus, disturbing the peace - broad interpretation - few complaints dealing with noise - more so dealing with construction companies. Skyline resident cuts grass at 9pm or 10pm at night - can respond to under ordinance. Majeski conferred with Janeen in Finance who also get calls re. noise disturbances. She agrees that we receive about 6 or 8 calls per week and all generally complain about: Construction work start times, Landscape start times, and a few regarding dirt bikes and the two regarding the oil/gas well pump at Warner's Nursery. Items prepared from Willoughby, Wickliffe, and Middlefield regarding their noise practices – distributed to Council. Somich – felt this should still be a personal issue – people having the ability to cut their lawn – in terms of start doing something at a certain time of the morning. Had never received a complaint from a resident in regards to noise starting early and late. Surprised to hear Mayor's assistant is getting that many complaints a week. Two neighbors complained to me about Bishop Road resident building a shed, cutting wood early on Sunday morning – calling and leaving voice messages on Building Inspector's voicemail.

<u>Reichelt</u> – our role here cues from enforcement/executive branch. Police Chief came and said we need something on the books – helpless in many circumstances – both indicated they want us to do this.

Germano – Willoughby's is quite restrictive – probably too much for us.

Fellows – construction – utilize as much daylight as they can? No, trying to miss the traffic and avoid heat of day. Construction is temporary. Reichelt – Classic was cooperative, but technically hard to enforce without something. Fellows – what about road construction? Fellows – what will the fine be? Discretion of the Officer of the fine? Reichelt – looking for a definition here to streamline and further define the noise ordinance. Biro – my complaints are more from people regarding not cutting their lawns. Fellows – property maintenance only as a component of the noise ordinance. Reichelt – this may never get used, probably would get a warning. Biro – there is an appeal process. Weger – police force will use discretion – not looking to give tickets, trying to make City safe and livable. Germano – 509.11b – Mayor may waive restrictions for businesses, etc – authorize people alright – can amend to say "for any reason." Could grant it or not grant it. Biro – are people compliant? No Ordinance to back them up. Reichelt – all for this – move it forward. Germano – Mayor should have restriction right for private use too – 509.11 (b) to "the Mayor may waive the restrictions in Section 509.11 (a) for any reason." Somich – trusts Executive Branch to enforce the right way.

- Public Records Policies, Property Maintenance Matters in future before and perhaps after recess.

#### **Public Portion**

Robert Kowalsky – what if I am the call who calls? Police comes and walks away – favoritism on what – there is another side to this – you are able to call you – police is able to come to neighbor you don't like – repeat offender "mucho bucks" – what is good for the city bids – to place that on the permit – a lenient time. What you are saying to write in – Police can go there and judge – remember that – not saving people – forget that whole paragraph – got enough in there – take care of construction permits. No other calls on Classic – they've started early – before 7:00am – if it is repeat offense that is when the hammer can come down.

<u>Linda Fulton</u> – a long time ago, 8:00pm that things couldn't start – the sewer project – they warm-up the machinery for at least 45 minutes – 9pm and 7am is the limitation. It's not all year round – people that work various hours of the day.

Joyce Grady – have heard various lawyers tell people that laws should be made on laws and not for personal reasons

- some policeman that were nasty - they didn't care - tone it down a little bit - very uncomfortable putting in restrictions on private things. Sending a policeman out - strictly on complaint of the neighbor - determines if person is breaking the law. Very careful on laws to keep the calm, quiet community.
