ORDINANCE NO. 2010-2

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING FINAL LEGISLATION AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR AND OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY HILLS TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DISTRICT 12 TO PROCEED WITH THE UPGRADE OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS AND INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS ALONG EUCLID-CHARDON ROAD (U.S.6) AND S.O.M. CENTER ROAD (S.R. 91) IN THE CITIES OF WILLOUGHBY HILLS AND WILLOUGHBY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2009, Council of the City of Willoughby Hills adopted Ordinance No. 2009-68, an Ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of Willoughby Hills to enter into a Preliminary Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation, District 12 to upgrade traffic signals and intersection improvements along Euclid-Chardon Road (U.S. 6) and S.O.M. Center Road (S.R. 91) in the Cities of Willoughby Hills and Willoughby; and

WHEREAS, The Director of Transportation has approved legislation proposing cooperation and has caused to be made plans and specifications and an estimate of cost and expense for improving the above described highway and has transmitted copies of the same to the City; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of Final Legislation, the City of Willoughby Hills has committed to pay an estimated amount of money as its share of the total estimated cost and expense of the highway project, that being Sixty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$62,550.00); and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Willoughby Hills agree to the terms and conditions as outlined in the **Final Resolution** consisting of three (3) pages and the **Contract** consisting of seven (7) pages attached hereto and referenced herein; and thereby have determined it to be in the public interest to provide consent to the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement..

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY HILLS, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. In order to proceed with the upgrade of traffic signals and intersection improvements along Euclid-Chardon Road (U.S.6) and S.O.M. Center Road (S.R. 91) in the Cities of Willoughby Hills and Willoughby, the Mayor and other Administrative Representatives are hereby authorized to execute the **Final Resolution**, consisting of three (3) pages, attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and thereby directed to enter into a **Contract** with the Ohio Department of Transportation, District 12, with said Contract consisting of seven (7) pages, attached hereto as **Exhibit "B"**.

SECTION 2. The actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were conducted in lawful meetings of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were held in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Willoughby Hills.


SECTION 3. This Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure in that the same provides for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Willoughby Hills, insofar as it provides for the usual daily operation of a municipal department and further reason to comply with the Ohio Department of Transportation's request that the legislation be enacted as soon as possible to expedite the highway project and thereby promote highway safety; wherefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval by the Mayor.


