AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN ANY AND ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS TO SECURE THE PURCHASE OF TWO (2) DODGE CHARGERS FROM CHARLIE'S DODGE, INC. OF MAUMEE, OHIO FOR A TOTAL COST NOT TO EXCEED \$46,924.00 WITH SAID PURCHASE BEING EXEMPT FROM COMPETITIVE BIDDING PURSUANT TO SECTION 125.04 (C) OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2011, Council adopted <u>Ordinance No. 2011-23</u> approving the purchase of two (2) new cars to continue the City's vital Police Car Rotation Program, started in 2003, the new cars were to be rotated into the Police Fleet and the older cars rotated out for disposal as surplus; and

WHEREAS, said purchase was pursuant to the Police Department Memorandum from Chief Christopher J. Collins to Mayor/Safety Director Robert M. Weger, dated April 7, 2011; Police Chief Collins respectfully requested approval for the purchase of two (2) Dodge Chargers from Greve Dodge, 750 West Ervin Road, Van Wert, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Police Chief Collins made contract with the representatives of Greve Dodge only to learn that they had no Chargers in stock and was given a delivery date of late in the year, possibly October; and

WHEREAS, since the City had not purchased any new police cars in 2010, a late delivery would severely impact our police fleet change over needs for this year; therefore a search was conducted for Dodge Dealerships that had immediate access to Police Chargers and that could meet or beat the State Contract Price; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Police Department Memorandum from Chief Christopher J. Collins to Mayor/Safety Director Robert M. Weger, dated May 5, 2011; Police Chief Collins respectfully requests approval for the purchase of two (2) Dodge Charger Police Cars located through Charlie's Dodge, Inc., in Maumee, Ohio for a cost not to exceed \$46,924.00; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Willoughby Hills approves of the immediate purchase of two (2) Dodge Chargers by utilizing funds from #234 – Safety Forces Special Revenue Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY HILLS, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to sign any and all necessary documents to secure the purchase of two (2) Dodge Chargers from Charlie's Dodge, Inc. located at 725 Illinois Avenue, Maumee, Ohio 43537 for a **cost not to exceed \$46,924.00**. Said purchase price does not include the cost of equipment changeover, installation and decaling.

SECTION 2. Vehicle Base Price is below Ohio DAS Contract #RS901410 pricing and the quote as submitted by Charlie's Dodge, Inc. of 725 Illinois Avenue, Maumee, Ohio 43537 complies with all requirements of RS901410 and Ohio HB 204.

SECTION 3. Said purchase is exempt from competitive bidding pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, Section 125.04 (C) and therefore must be in accordance with the provisions stipulated in ORC 125.04(C).

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 2011-23 be and is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 5. The actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were conducted in lawful meetings of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were held in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Willoughby Hills.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure in that the same provides for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Willoughby Hills, insofar as it provides for the usual daily operation of the Police Department, and further reason being that this will allow the City to utilize the price quote as received from Charlie's Dodge, Inc. without jeopardizing the availability of the vehicles while taking advantage of pricing lower than the State Contract; wherefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
