The report contains important information and statistics reflecting the commitment of our staff in meeting the various challenges of providing outstanding police services to our community. We're always evaluating our goals, objectives, and law enforcement programs to ensure we meet the needs of our community.

Our top priority continues to be those crimes that affect the safety, welfare, and quality of life in our community. To meet this goal we continue to be progressive in our policing strategies and our search for new equipment and technology to enhance our investigative capabilities. This year we used forfeited monies to purchase a state of the art digital fingerprint scanner that saves officers time and links the prints directly to federal, state, and local databases.

The police department's community outreach programs continue to be well received especially our Summer Safety Town Program and the "Kids Print" Identification Card System purchased with funds from our Law Enforcement Trust Fund. This system is used to prints ID Cards for children and young adults at several City events and for our seniors during their "Senior Day" activities.

The strength of our department continues to be our police officers, dispatchers and administrative staff. Their dedication and experience leads to the successful adjudication of our traffic and criminal cases, the high compliance ratings for our in-house jail facility and juvenile intervention programs.
