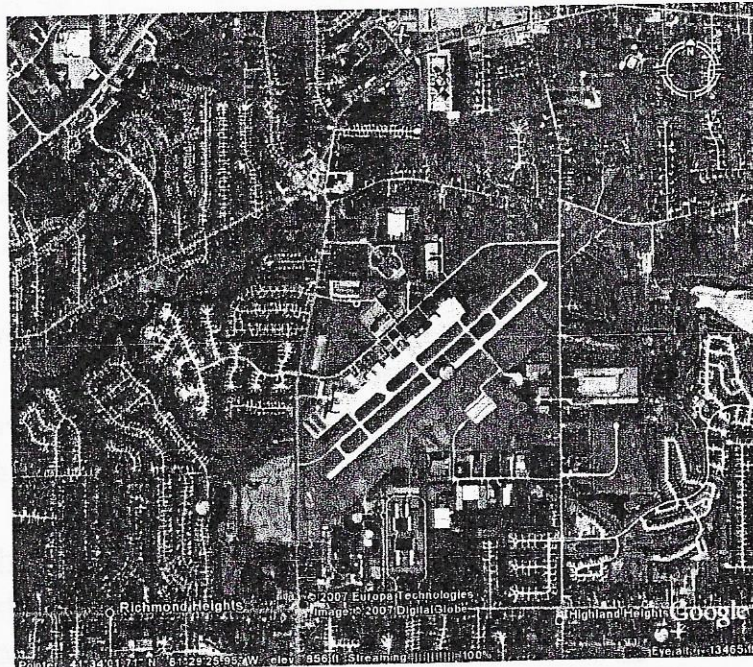

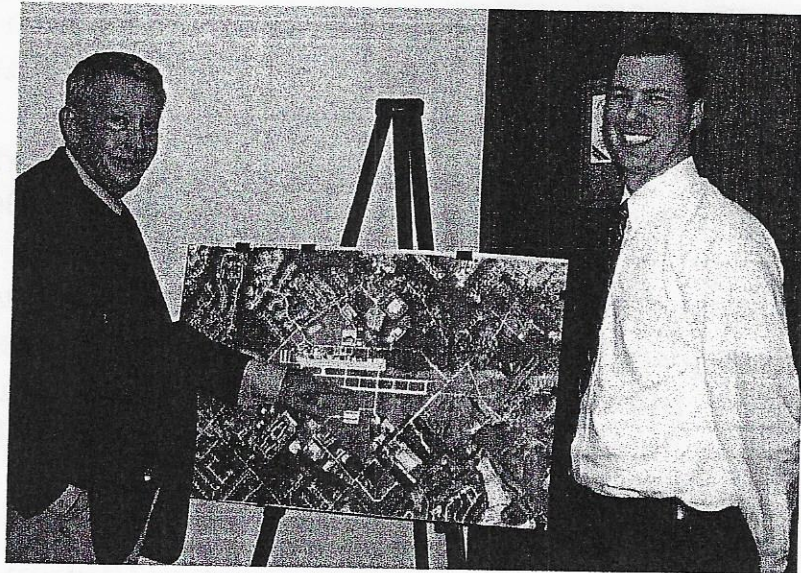
Mayor Kenneth A. Lorenz
Mayor's Report
City of Milloughby Hills
Thursday, January 25, 2007

- About a week and a half ago I received an e-mail from Mayor Anderson requesting a meeting before the Mayor's and Manager's meeting on Monday, January 22nd. Unfortunately no one, besides myself, responded so we tried to meet after the Mayor's and Manager's Meeting. Mayor Dave Anderson, Mayor Ted Andrzejewski and I were the only ones able to attend.
 - Mayor Anderson shared his disappointment with us that he has received little or no input from the west-end mayors in the last three to four months.
 - He did state he has recently spoken with Chief of Police, James Fox, of Wickliffe regarding the dispatch center. He shared with us that Chief Fox did not believe the west-end dispatch center would work nor save money for the City of Wickliffe.
 - Mayor Anderson said he would contact his consultant, David Reichelt, to develop a questionnaire to distribute to the west-end mayors. He would like to have input regarding the number of projected employees, estimated payroll, projected number of calls and other factors that are to be determined.
 - He advised that when he receives all the responses he will review them with his consultant to see if we should move forward.

- As I reported at the last council meeting, it could take up to two years with the new study. With the time frame and the admission of doubt in the project, I strongly request, more than ever, that council concur with the renovation of our own dispatch center.
- On Wednesday, January 24th, 2007, there was an open house at Willoughby Hills Community Center for the new director of Willoughby-Eastlake Public Library, Kathy Dugan. The continental breakfast started at 8:30 a.m. and was well attended by library representatives from all branches. Mayor Ted Andrzejewski and I were in attendance.
- On the afternoon of Wednesday, January 24th, 2007, I attended a meeting with Rich Iafelice, City Engineer, and Tom Risk of Trammell Crow Healthcare Service. We met to settle the issue regarding Cleveland Clinic's participation with the traffic light on SOM Center Rd.
 - He stated that they will soon send a letter of intent stating that they have agreed and have budgeted for the project. They will contribute up to \$60,000.
 - This is good news because Jim Brown of Classic Auto Dealership has offered to pay half.
 - The projected cost of the project is \$100,000.
- Mayor Kenneth Lorenz met Thursday, January 24th, 2007, with Kevin M. Delaney, appointed as Cuyahoga County Airport Manager just last Thursday, January 18th. Mayor Lorenz recently received phone calls from concerned Willoughby Hills residents on Tall Tree Trail and Canterbury Court, and took the initiative to meet with Delaney to discuss airport news. Delaney indicated that airport officials, Cuyahoga County Commissioners and the FAA had been in discussion regarding 36 potential scenarios for the future of the airport.

- Delaney indicated that all facts and figures point towards airport expansion. Based on recommendations, the airport will most likely increase the length of the runway into Willoughby Hills by 900 feet, and extend the safety zone into Willoughby Hills by an additional 1000 feet. Expansion would go into the Airport Greens Golf Course and beyond. The FAA, Cuyahoga County and airport would most likely have to purchase residential property to accomplish this. No definite plans have been undertaken, but it is estimated that purchase of ten to fifteen homes would be necessary to carry out the expansion.
- The airport would also consider a Bishop Road underpass, where road traffic would go through a tunnel underpass, allowing the runway traffic to go above ground.
- Delaney is quick to point out that all expansion plans are subject to a lengthy process. An environmental impact study could take up to two years, followed by a noise abatement study which could take well over a year. Adding several years of planning phases could push final construction off up to ten into the future.





- Delaney will be mailing out announcements to public officials and residents on or about February 12th, inviting them to a work session with the airport on Tuesday, February 27th. Public officials will have a separate meeting scheduled during the day, and the general public will be invited to attend the evening open house at the Willoughby Hills Community Center.

The Police Department:

- WHPD Officers Naegele, Gerardi and K-9 Partner Arrow, conducted a traffic stop on IR 90 that led to the arrest of a 22 year old Massachusetts woman for felony possession of 110 pounds of marijuana. This had an estimated street value of \$400,000. The woman admitted to picking up the marijuana in Wisconsin and trying to transport it back to the Boston area.
- An investigation into the burglary of the Willoughby Hills Giant Eagle conducted by Detective Broadwater and the initial responding officers: Sgt. Planisek and Officers McDermott and Naegele, led to the conviction Selvin Cunningham. Cunningham was sentenced to 12 ½ years in prison. This complex investigation involved several local police departments who assisted in the pursuit and arrest of Cunningham in Cleveland. The outstanding investigative work and handling of evidence resulted in his conviction. Cunningham is a career criminal.

- Officers are investigating the theft of copper piping from the construction site of the new units at Pine Ridge Valley Apartments. An undetermined amount of piping was stolen.
- Officers are investigating the theft and fraudulent use of bank checks by a male suspect in the local area. He has attempted to pass the stolen checks at several local businesses.
- A 55 year old resident was arrested for driving under suspension and possession of prescription drugs after officers responded to a disturbance call.
- Officers continue to receive reports of storage lockers being broken into at Par Lane Apartments. Personal items stored in these lockers are being stolen. Residents have been alerted not to keep valuables in these lockers.
- With the approval of the Mayor and City Council, Chief Collins ordered four 2007 Dodge Charger Police Cars. These new cars will be placed into frontline patrol service and replace the older police cars with more than 90,000 miles on them.
- Car 775s transmission has been repaired and is back in service. Car 784 was hit by a deer and is in for body repairs. There was no major functional damage to the car.
- On January 24th, 2007 at approximately 6:06 a.m., officers of the Willoughby Hills Police Department responded to a roll over accident on IR 90 westbound under the SR 91 (SOM Center Rd.) bridge.
 - The driver and sole occupant of the vehicle was a 47 year old male out of Geneva, Ohio. He was not injured, but was arrested for failure to control his motor vehicle and driving under suspension.

- Preliminary investigation shows the male was westbound on IR 90 in the left lane. For unknown reasons he lost control of his vehicle and went off the right side of the roadway, up an embankment and rolled over onto the roof. The male was operating a 1996 Ford Probe, maroon in color.
- Upon arrival of police and fire, the male was out of the vehicle and walking around. He signed a medical release refusing any treatment. Alcohol and drugs do not appear to be a factor at this time.

The Fire Department:

EQUIPMENT:

- The new ambulance is scheduled to be delivered by early February and should be in service by March 1, 2007.
- Engine 1213: The computer which controls the Detroit diesel and the fire pump failed. It has been repaired and the engine is back in service.
- Car 1221: The intake manifold and brakes are being repaired and the car should be back in service by this Friday, January 26, 2007.
- Car 1211: Transmission is slipping and is out of service until repairs can be made. The unit should be back in service by the end of next week.
- The Mayfield Village loaner ambulance is still in second out service.

The Service Department:

- Winter work is underway at the Service Department, which includes tree trimming and street sign repair and maintenance. The night shift is painting equipment and cleaning and painting building interiors.

- We are installing a trench drain in the Mechanics' Shop Garage, which will drain to a new oil separator.
- Pump Stations Eddy 1, Eddy 2 and Fairview are all now operational. We now have eight pump stations in operation and will soon have a ninth pump station when the Woodlands Station is activated.
- Dye tests continue as residents are connected to the sanitary sewer.
- We are preparing the 2006 Annual Report to Lake County on behalf of the City's Stormwater Management Program.
- 2007 updates to the City website are in place. Additional e-mail support for new addresses is given on a continual basis for departments in transition.

- Web traffic has continued to increase exponentially: from 77 visitors the first full month the website was operational in 2004, to over 1700 visitors in just one month last year. (These figures do not include traffic generated by robots, worms, or replies with special HTTP status codes.) Our statistics show that the City website had over 17,000 unique visitors last year. Statistics also show many were accessing the site to download forms, such as Recreation applications, Building registration packets and Brush drop-off forms, thus saving the City money in printing and dispensing forms, and saving City Staff time in informational phone calls.
