MAYOR'S REPORT – Kenneth A. Lorenz

- On Tuesday, February 14th, I attended the Fifth Third Bank Grand Opening on 5821 SOM Center Road.
- I attended the Lake County Historical Society Dinner at LaMalfa on Saturday, February 18th.
- On Wednesday, February 22nd, I attended the Troop #562 Meeting at Garfield School and presented John Krauss with a Proclamation for his dedication to the Boy Scouts and the City of Willoughby Hills.
- Thursday, February 23rd, I attended the Willoughby Area Chamber of Commerce Luncheon and presented the Willoughby Hills State of the City Report.
- **Police Department**
 - Sgt. Lanning and Officer Mullenax responded to several reports of cars being broken into in the area of White Road and Parkview Drive. Their investigation led to the tracking of foot prints in the snow to a Parkview home. Once at the home, the officers made contact with the homeowner and determined his teenage son and another friend spending the night had committed the car break-ins. The two teenage boys confessed to the crimes and were processed by Officer Mullenax for the pending criminal charges.

- Sgt. Lanning and Officer DiMuzio assisted Richmond Heights PD and Wickliffe PD in the pursuit of a stolen car with two suspects in it. Both suspects were arrested and are suspected of being involved in several car thefts in this area.
- Officer Naegele made a traffic stop on IR-90 that resulted in the seizure of \$13,777 in U.S. currency hidden in a 1999 Pontiac Van. This criminal investigation has been adopted by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).
- Detective Vitale successfully completed a computer crimes course sponsored by the Ohio Peace Officer training Commission.
- Detective Vitale is being reassigned to the Patrol Division after spending six months assisting the Detective Bureau with their large case load.
- **Fire Department**
 - **Routine Maintenance:**
 - Car 1211 is out of service - blown transmission
 - Engine 1213 is out of service - braking problem and leaking pump valves
 - **Emergency Services:**
 - Significant incidents since our last report: assisted Kirtland Fire Department with an engine company, at a House Fire on Hobart road; assisted Wickliffe Fire Department for a multi-victim vehicle crash on Euclid Avenue; rescued and treated a patient who received severe injuries while participating in winter sporting event, our EMS crew's level of care was exceptional and the patient is well on the way to a full recovery. Job well done to "A" Shift
 - Officers Naegele and Gerardi with K-9 partner Arrow made a traffic stop on IR-90 that resulted in the arrest of a male suspect traveling from the State of Washington to Boston, MA for a traffic violation and possession of 33 pounds of high grade marijuana. The marijuana has an estimated street value of \$462,000. The marijuana was found hidden in the interior of the car.
 - The Fire Department has responded to 200 emergency incidents during 2006; with an average of about 4 emergency responses per day
- **Service Department**
 - Pickup truck prices have been given to the Mayor
 - We are accepting bids for the (snow-and-ice removal/asphalt moving) dump truck through noon on March 3rd. Specifications are available at the Mayor's Office, Front Desk and Service Department. Ads ran on February 20th and 21st in the News Herald and the Plain Dealer and will run again on February 27 in the News Herald.
 - We are meeting with the Lake County Stormwater Management Team to discuss Ditch Maintenance Projects for 2006.
 - We are assisting the Building Department in revisions of their Procedure book (previously named Building Department Guidelines) for both residential and commercial Plans. Doing the graphic layout and design in-house should save roughly \$5,000.00.
 - Police pages on the website have been updated to include Chief Collins' most recent article "Protect Your Family from Sexual Predators." We are in the process of updating the Recreation pages for Spring: Registrations, Day Camp, Sports Camp, Safety Town, etc.
- **Recreation Department**
 - **Recreation Pancake Breakfasts:** March 5th and March 12th. Willoughby Hills Auto Repair purchased a quantity of tickets – with each oil change they will give away one free breakfast ticket.
 - **Summer Day Camp** – Willoughby Eastlake School Superintendent approved the distribution of fliers to all schools in the District. They are very supportive of our Summer Programs. Brochures distributed this week to Edison, Grant, McKinley, and upon additional printing, will cover the remainder of schools. Also distributed to Immaculate Conception.
 - University Hospitals is sponsoring Day Camp T-Shirts, Geauga Lake Field Trip, and will also be involved in Safety Day.
 - Friendly's Restaurants sponsoring Cleveland Metroparks Zoo Trip (also will offer Day Camp brochures in restaurant).
 - Additional businesses are responding to requests submitted in late '05 for Field Trip Sponsorships, and supplies such as water, snacks, sunscreen, visors, etc.
 - **Sports Camps** – same School Distribution as above.

- Safety Town – secured a highly recommended local instructor. This required the date to change to July 24 through August 4. (Confirmed). In addition to University Hospital, Rainbow Babies & Children and Safe Kids Greater
- Cleveland will sponsor providing T-Shirts, teacher's aides, equipment, etc. Class size is limited to 15. May have to add an additional session and we may have to enlist a volunteer to assist with Program Coordination.
- All Camp info will be available on the City's website within approximately one week. News-Herald and Lake County Gazette also promoting.
- Girls Softball Registration – January 23rd through March 19th. Sign-ups will be available at the first 3 pancake breakfasts, and one evening sign-up is scheduled for March 15th at the Community Center. Friendly's Restaurants is a new team sponsor this year. Additional businesses/civic groups committing to sponsorships.
- Photo Contest – co-sponsoring with Willoughby Hills Library. Theme: Paws, Claws, Scales and Tales. Late-spring to early summer. Dodd Camera has donated prizes. Fliers will be available within the coming month.
- Spring Nature Walks – John Lillich conducting annual walks at Hach-Otis on April 22nd and May 13th. The Heart of Lake County Magazine will feature an article on Hach-Otis and Squires Castle in their April, 2006 issue.
