Continued Discussion on <u>Ordinance 2011-56</u>: Contractor Registration – current set for Third Reading on Thursday. <u>Fellows</u> – still has some concerns about it – nebulous, could potentially set us up for litigation, have ordinance in place. <u>Weger</u> – must protect the residents and we need a remedy to do it – trying to be friendly to contractors, but also protect our residents. "For any good cause" added by the Law Director – would give us what we need – after the fact. <u>Germano</u> – if we put it out there, we can always take it back out as well. <u>Reichelt</u> – got to trust Building Official.

Recommendation to Adopt at Council on Thursday.

Ordinance 2011-60: Permanent Easement Ordinance for Sanitary Sewer

<u>Iafelice</u> – reported to the Council in Utilities Committee – three property owners who cut their own agreement on White Road, joined two property owners on White Road. These are the easements – operate and maintain sewer service to the City. Built to City's specifications.

Recommendation to waive Three Readings and Adopt at Council on Thursday.

Ordinance 2011-##: Summer Sprinkling Program Amendments

Potential to repeal an amendment in the 2005 ordinance – they also found that we owe them money because the program is officially only for single-family homes and not condominiums – we negotiated and got the different – we want to correct that for next year. Reichelt – doesn't the Summer Sprinkling program cost us anyway? Weger – only thing it costs us is our portion – in the condos, we have to pay Euclid the sewer rate to make it happen – it costs the City just for the condo owners, whereas for the home, no issue. Reichelt had spoken to one of them, Euclid is what it is – as long as we pay for it – was not in their agreement with us – only includes 1, 2, 3 family dwellings. Cleveland initiated the program – told Wickliffe, WH, and Willowick about it – Wickliffe was looking at it – we bought the program. How you could discriminate – has nothing to do with property taxes. They do pay a higher rate, when someone in a house can get credit for it. Perhaps we should get rid of it all together – would be generating more revenue and more equitable. How can you take those people and discriminate that? Instead of repairing the agreement, going to put a band-aid on it.

Will remain in Committee, not to be placed on Agenda. Will be heard in Utilities on November 21st.

Ordinance 2011-##: River's Edge Drive for Dedication/Public Use

<u>Iafelice</u> – long time in coming, never formally gone through acceptance – accept road for public use and dedication. **Recommendation to waive Three Readings and Adopt at Council on Thursday.**

Ordinance 2011-##: Part-Time Road Worker

 $\underline{\text{Weger}}$ – in the changes we made with the Service Department – hire PT people through an agency, there are some workers out there to hire residents and require the CDL Class B so they can drive the snowplow and little trucks. Have a couple of people lined up that have these qualifications. Protection for us to have people ready to plow – get some relief PT – leaves for three weeks and snowplowing for duration of winter.

Recommendation to waive Three Readings and Adopt at Council on Thursday.

Ordinance 2011-##: Deer Management over 5 acres

<u>Mayor</u> – definitely only be bow and arrow – 5 acres, can't be within 500 feet of a residence – drive into Gatsby – five of them sitting on the front lawn – there are just too many of them. Many research – passing around – park system also encouraged – help them out – totally regulated – know what they are doing. All the ODNR rules – not involved in tagging them, etc. Kirtland has this, Waite Hill has this, in our ordinance – no hunting in the City limits currently. Very regulated – ODNR controls the hunting – all other aspects under Ohio law. <u>Fellows</u> – Chief Collins – has been with City 11 years – any fatalities deer related – no – May and November worse months – mating and running – majority on the interstate. <u>Fiebig</u> – can we call the permit a "property management" permit – this isn't for recreational hunting – control population in an efficient way. Property management deer permit. Hunting prohibited is section and title of it currently. Still have to have hunting license for Ohio – September to February. Firearms is only a week. Muskets is another time. Is 5 acre the right number, or should be looking at 6 or 8? Most are one acre – got to be 300 feet. 5 up on the hill past Rogers.

<u>Reichelt</u> – consider about humanity – is bow and arrow the most humane way? It's the sport – bow and arrow – not accurate – people don't track it – take out of its misery. Things written about that in ODNR. Say it runs and sits next to house.

Will remain in Committee – not to be placed on the Agenda.

Also, the Service Committee recommended the advancement of the two ordinances referred to the Committee by Engineer Iafelice to the agenda at Thursday's meeting.

Weger – plan to have total budget done by December, and pass it over to the Council – pass before end of the year.

Public Portion

Frank Cihula – on contractor registration, current ordinance does a nice job – would not mess with 90 day thing – suspended after October 1st – all expire December 31st of every year – if they renew, they get a cheaper rate. February on they get that cheaper rate. Last issue with contractor – no authority to refuse to register – just talks about it – doesn't give authority to do that. For any good cause phrase, take it out and belabor that phrase. Sprinkling – our Summer sewer/water bill – one half of water units in some years – know sewers do not leak. Deer – my wife got hit by a 12-point buck on truck – cab repainted to get truck. Looked straight in the eye – hit back in – in favor of that ordinance. Linda Fulton – not in favor of deer ordinance – understand what Frank is saying – for a resident that has 5 acres or more. How many deer could they possibly get to make a difference – worried about residents that are not a good shot – then what, bring in coyotes. There are some wolf and fox in area. Can't see – have it on my property – deer do damage. Park system has shootings. Go out and shoot bow and arrow. Closed at 8:34pm

Lamplight Lane flooding analysis is underway and consulting with SWM officials on ways to mitigate flooding.
