LAW DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Thomas G. Lobe, L.P.A.

- Law Director Lobe wanted to restate just for Council's edification, in case they don't know, is that the Mayor has twice a month meetings with all the directors and these meetings have become better and better as we have gone along. We meet twice a month starting at 9:00am and go anywhere from 10:00am to 11:00am; the Mayor is there, the Executive Assistant, the Fire Chief, the Police Chief, the Finance Department, the Assistant to the Finance Department, the Building Department, the Clerk of Courts, the Law Department, and even recreation. There is a good flow of information and it is amazing that even in a small City like this is that you have to put everybody in a room and once we go around and talk about our issues, how it impacts everybody else. It has been a good exchange and that is why the issues have been resolved internally because you can't do things by email, or by letter, you have to sit down in a room and that is why things have been very good. Additionally, we also have twice a month meetings with myself, the Mayor and the Engineer, so we also keep abreast of a lot of things that Council hears here, at Council Meetings, except on a more expansive level. Rich goes through all the issues and tries to keep us abreast of the good, the bad and the indifferent and we try to resolve a lot of the issues administratively.
- The Law Director is working with the Building Department and Fred Wyss has been doing a pretty good job in resolving a lot of the issues through meetings; we examine things and we meet with him fairly often and we are getting things done without just sending out harsh letters.

Purpose of the Meeting was to discuss City Finances and any other business.

Meeting convened at 5:04 p.m.

Order of Business

- Meeting called to order. Reviewed July reports and August. We discussed a few items with negative balances in budget. Consensus of the Committee was to accept reports.
- Finance Director updated several areas:
 - (1) Income Tax Revenue up after 9 months by 8% over 2010. If last quarter is even with 4th Quarter 2010, will be \$150,000 up
 - (2) Safety Levy Revenue after 9 months equals our projection for 12month revenue. This could be \$200,000 excess after 12 months.
 - (3) Property Tax Revenue should be equal or up slightly.
 - (4) Court Revenue expected to be down \$70,000 for the year.
 - (5) Recycling Expense higher than expected.
 - (6) Police and fire overtime higher than budgeted due to recent crime investigations
 - (7) Some unexpected property improvements were needed.
 - (8) Wary of Salt Budget, if we have bad early winter.
 - (9) Bill paying current through September.
- Second topic was proposed non-profit gambling center in VF Outlet building, with concerns for City lease liability and demand on City safety services, also overall image relative to vacancies in this area.

Public Portion opened at 5:44 p.m.

<u>Christian Haffey</u>, 2871 Camelot, Willoughby Hills, Ohio is the one who presented the proposal. Believes the expressed concerns can be remedied by letter from property owner as to liability, and their own safety efforts. Suggests City

establishes Committee to determine which non-profit groups are approved, and then will pay a registration fee.

<u>Linda Fulton</u> expressed her past satisfaction with Nautica's Charities operation experiences. She believes this project "could be a good thing".

With no one else coming forth from the public sector to speak, Public Portion was closed at 5:54 p.m.

- Finance Director then discussed next audit cycle, and for the City to consider every 2 years instead of annual state audit. Historically, for 2009, City spent \$36,000 on the audit for 1100 billable audit hours. For 2010, City spent \$27,000 on audit for 800 hours. Lesser hours is due to improved efficiencies. Bi-annual audit would save City approximately 90%. The main disadvantage is delay in finding problems faster (if any) and we are not eligible for awards from the State.
- Also, compilation office had 3 year contract with City for their work. Finance Director suggests we spend \$2,000 per year to get more valuable schedules to use. Consensus to o to bi-annual audit and spend more to get reports.

Continued Discussion on Ordinance 2011-56: Contractor Registration

<u>Law Director Lobe</u> – prior contractor that we had some issues with - BZA had language amendment – good causes from Building and Zoning Inspector – give tools to the building department to say if you should be working in our jurisdiction – they have been sued or gone bankrupt – if we know that, we have a duty to prevent those contractors from coming in – there is an appeals process to the BZA – gives latitude to Building Department.

Many people on the street don't know that has not seen – all the same principle and getting by and get a new corporation. There needs to be a first line of defense – revocation and suspension – if you knew the guy was a child molester. Would you grant him a certificate? Give you the most extreme example – knew the company went bankrupt four times. When we do the bidding process - not the lowest bid – have they gone bankrupt? Projects letting people have it – go to our citizenry – very liberal and very sweeping. Rather give our people the tools to do it –and there is an administrative remedy. Ounce of prevention. Somich – do like erring on behalf of residents – when a contractor is registered – guarantee it that – I'd rather be cautious on that side – if we restrict a corporation from doing business and we establish that criteria – are we opening up liability? Lobe – we still have immunity – we revoke them and suspend them – everything done with rational and reasonable basis – reasonable appeal process in the city – previous building department – suspend somebody that we thought – bankrupt a few times – fine him rather than suspend him. Close some loopholes – administrative decision-maker too much authority unbridled.

Appeals process for the BZA was outlined. Fiebig – argue position passionately – extend on 90 day suspension – he will revoke it. They will suspend it – he can revoke it. Look at C. When this guy applies – how is he going to do this? Going to do a better business bureau such? Pay their fee and they are in – breaks in the first line of defense. Good, rational basis. Do some research and they find it. Fred was approached with this. Responsibility still falls on the homeowner, but they do look to the city for some guidance. Reichelt – could be appealed to higher court? Is there a possibility we could be fined? Lobe – still have sovereign immunity it – ten bad contractors come through – not foolproof – this is a good one. That guy – 90 day suspension – time and effort on that particular – 15 to 20 residents. Every case was different.

<u>Cihula</u> – two wording changes – **Section 2 (d): change "Where" to "when. Past performance change to "any failure to resolve previous suspensions or revocations."**

Section C – contractor is suspended in last 90 days of the year – all registration renewed at the beginning of the year – holder of license – reinstate certificate. Five cases that were cited – building inspector has previously worked. Did not have any jurisdiction. Showed not a good worker. Decision would have been different. Appeals process all the way to a court of law. Have faith in fire department, etc. Make inspections. City hires a contractor – solicit references up and down. Fiebig – should review bond and 90 day suspension.

Deer Management Discussion

<u>Reichelt</u> – going to take some thought – there was some news story about the State moving on contraception – sensitive issue – get reactive about – Solon is a good example. Comprehensive plan for culling and prevention – group from Toledo – Deer Preservation Act – if any one kills a deer – whistleblower retaliation. <u>Somich</u> – why we don't allow for bow hunting – am with Ellen Foley Kessler – they have had great discussions with Lake Metroparks – something needs to be done – serious problem.

Consensus to list on the agenda for first reading on Thursday with amendments as highlighted.

Snowplowing at next meeting on October 24th – Councilman Germano to coordinate with Clerk.

Public Portion

Frank Cihula – great majority of the people – misfortunate of being in a vehicle with a deer hitting it – three people that hit them. Civilization – no natural predators for the deer. Cleveland Metroparks culling deer for years. Linda Fulton – first of all, in favor of contractors go – would it hold up in court – as long as you are not arbitrary and capricious. Totally misapplies it – don't anticipate it going that far. Good police officers. We have a situation on Marcum/Parkview – tree went down and cut out electricity – if that goes, falls onto the wires – is there anything. City can go in there and do the work – ordinance in place – easy for city to go in there and do it. Robert Kowalsky – I take it is legal to have bow and arrow on property – send a resolution to the state of Ohio and say it would be great to do a bit of drug on this deer – lets get back to the bad guys – going to be doing C and protect those people. How about a questionnaire? Make a statement and everything – no one reads that – can't expect them to go by those rules – what subs will be involved – and also, the employees – you know – will you ah, hire child molesters – will you hire anyone indicted or convicted of any kind of felony. If they say yes, he actually has cause – drugs, roofers wanted drug test. That guy knows and that guy don't want him – person applying going to be in jeopardy. Tricked me on a minute. Hope you would kind of figure this out without killing yourselves with bad legislation.
