

ROAD WORK SET FOR FALL 2016

Two major Road Levy projects are set to begin in September, impacting the daily commute of many of our residents. City Engineer Pete DiFranco of Richard L. Bowen and Associates has prepared the following information to best explain the scope and funding for the projects and construction information.

SR 91

- Scope: Repair and resurfacing of 3.80 miles of SR 91, from the Willoughby Hills southern corporation line to US 20 in the City of Willoughby.
- Funding: Project is collaboration between NOACA, Lake County, Willoughby Hills, & Willoughby, with funding being provided in part by a federal grant administered through the NOACA Provisional Transportation Asset Management Program (PTAM).
- Project Management: Construction will be managed by the Lake County Engineer's office.
- Approximate cost of construction: \$2.2 million
- Contractor: The Shelly Company
- Anticipated construction Timeframe: September 1-November 15, 2016

Worrell Rd

- Scope: Repair & resurfacing of 1.2 miles of Worrell Rd between the Geauga County Line and Euclid-Chardon Rd.
- Funding: Project is a collaboration between Willoughby Hills and Kirtland, with funding being provided in part by a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission.
- Project Management: Construction will be managed by Willoughby Hills, who is the lead agency.
- Approximate cost of construction: \$346,400
- Contractor: Portions of work to be performed by a contractor (TBD), as well as Willoughby Hills and Kirtland Service Department staff.
- Anticipated construction Timeframe: September 19-November 15, 2016
