It's been a busy 2013 for the Economic Development department. So far:

- The Dollar Tree opened in The Shoppes At Willoughby Hills
- Brindaliers Bar & Grill held its grand opening in the Chagrin North complex
- O'Reilly's Auto Parts broke ground for a new store on Chardon Road which will open in August
- Dunkin' Donuts purchased property for a new store to be built on Bishop Road this fall
- Clover Development has applied to build senior living apartments in the Chagrin North complex
- The city began negotiating with a potential tenant for the vacant Eaton Training Center
- We have also been working with the Willoughby Area Chamber of Commerce to enhance the city's image by holding various chamber events at area locations, which have included The Willoughby Hills Community Center, St. Noel's Banquet Room and La-Vera's Party Center.

In addition, we have updated the economic development web site with a new look and are looking forward to working with businesses to take advantage of the influx of 10,000 runners who will be participating in the next Color Run, to be held September 21st.

The vision, planning and execution of this project will long be remembered as a special task by a very committed member of our City Council. CUYAHOGA COUNTY AIRPORT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The Cuyahoga County Airport Environmental Assessment is now underway. This study is part of the process being conducted by the F.A.A. as it reviews the proposed Master Plan for the airport. Beyond the airport's effect on the environment, it also examines the impact on area residents. Thus, a critical component of the process is to gather input from the public about how the airport affects lives and properties in the area.

This is a time when residents can make their feelings about the airport known to the F.A.A. as all submitted comments will be included in the study record. SERVICE PROJECTS

The following is a status report of the various service projects in our city:

- 1) **VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK** - Job is complete. Plans to re-do the bridge are underway to change the pitch of the bridge to make it more conducive to pedestrian traffic. Recreation Department will establish a policy to make the gazebo a structure that the City could rent out for ceremonies.
- 2) **ROGERS ROAD SLOPE STABILIZATION** - Marous Brothers finished the final repair of the slope failure and the road is currently open for travel.
- 3) **LAMPLIGHT LANE - EUCLID CREEK EAST BRANCH DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS** - Lake County Stormwater Management is researching this project to secure the best possible plan to move forward on this project. The County has pledged \$361,000 for this project.
- 4) **CRICKET LANE DRAINAGE** - Service Director Nate Catania and City Engineer DiFranco have met with Lake County Stormwater Management to move this project forward with County funding.
- 5) **2013 PAVEMENT MARKINGS PROGRAM** - City Council approved the bid of \$28,535.10 by Pat Flowers. Work will commence following crack sealing by Service Department.
- 6) **MAPLEGROVE PAVEMENT PROJECT** - City Carron Asphalt began work on 7/15/13 and is due to complete by 8/15/13.
- 7) **DODD'S LANDING PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS** - City Council approved the bid of Specialized Construction. Work began on July 1, 2013, and should be done prior to newsletter print date.
- 8) **CLOVER CONGREGATE CARE (IN CHAGRIN NORTH COMPLEX)** - Site plans still being reviewed by PC-ABR.
- 9) **PLEASANT VALLEY ROAD BRIDGE** - County advised City of corrosion and need for immediate repair. Service Department is working with County officials to repair and reduce load allowance.
- 10) **GATSBY/KRISTEN INTERSECTION PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS** - Bid opening July 11, 2013, for this project.
- 11) **O'REILLY AUTO PARTS (27650 CHARDON ROAD)** - Construction began May 2013. Anticipated completion date is August 17, 2013.

Community Center Entrance to Get New Look

Thanks to a generous grant from Lake County Community Development Block Grant Program, the Willoughby Hills Community Center at 35400 Chardon Road will be getting a new look to its entrance in the fall.

The \$10,000 grant will enable the City to install ADA access doors to the building entrance. This will enable visitors to the Community Center and Willoughby-Eastlake Library an easier way to enter the building.

As the building celebrates its 10-year anniversary, it is a great time to make this addition to the center. We look forward to making the transition to the new doors a smooth one for all visitors and anticipate a construction start date in October 2013.



COLOR RUN RECAP

On Saturday, June 8, 2013, the City of Willoughby Hills was home to "Color Run", also known as the "Happiest 5K on the Planet." The Color Run is a five-kilometer, un-timed race in which thousands of participants are doused from head to toe with biodegradable colored corn starch at four race intervals. The unique paint race celebrates healthiness, happiness, individuality and giving back to the community. Each of the color stations are manned by volunteer groups from the community.

When Councilman Ray Somich first approached the Color Run group, he recognized the opportunity to bring 8000 participants to the City of Willoughby Hills. With the help of the Mayor and the city's safety and service departments, his dream became a reality. The race began at 8:00 a.m. and by noon you could hardly tell anything had occurred. The streets were reopened as quickly as possible. The participants stayed and enjoyed many of the Willoughby Hills restaurants and shops, just as Councilman Somich had envisioned. This was a real boost to our community and, hopefully, the beginning of more patronage in our community.

A second Color Run is slated for Saturday, September 21, 2013 and the businesses and residents will be notified of the event. Willoughby Hills businesses are encouraged to embrace the event as an opportunity to showcase their business.

Representatives from VFW Post 4358, Mayor Weger, the members of City Council, and a capacity crowd were on hand for the dedication of our new Veterans Memorial Park on Memorial Day, 2013. The facility features a gazebo and permanent amphitheater-style seating that will be used for the annual Memorial Day and Veteran's Day ceremonies, as well as weddings, summer concerts, and other recreational activities.

The project originated last year after the Veterans Memorial Commission (consisting of former Mayor Mort O'Ryan, former Councilman Larry O'Donnell, and Mayor Weger) approved the concept and a fund was established to collect donations to fund the construction. Although many have been received, we are still accepting donations from anyone interested in honoring or supporting veterans. All revenues will be used exclusively for the construction and maintenance of the facility and honorees and sponsors will be recognized on permanent markers.

Striving Towards a Better Place to Live

We are excited to introduce our community to the residents and businesses of Willoughby Hills. Stratford Place is a 57 unit townhouse community that is located off Chardon Road near Bishop Road. These newly built, 3 level, spacious homes were constructed between 2006-2007 and are privately owned by an ethnically diverse group of individuals. Our homeowners live and operate independently of the city. Our community is governed by the Board of Directors which is comprised of 5 Stratford homeowners who are elected by other Stratford homeowners and volunteer their time to oversee community issues and concerns. Through Board direction, homeowners are provided such services as lawn maintenance, snow plowing, garbage pick-up, street lights, and much more. There is no monetary compensation for Board members who officially convene once a month to conduct the Association's business even though their dedication and concern require day-to-day attentiveness. Even though the Stratford townhomes are privately owned, residents have collectively participated in various community social gatherings in our common areas which have featured a barbecue and a kid's costume contest and clown. There have also been group maintenance activities such as window washing and door painting.

Stratford Place is still growing and finding our way while continuing to improve our neighborhood. We are proud to be a part of the Willoughby Hills community.
